
Introduction

The Moral Education Program prepares learners for the ever-rapid changes in social fabric, as well as the need to assess and track trends and changes in moral, community, civic and cultural aspects. It safeguards accomplishments in the formation of a unique local character, preserves national heritage and deters adverse behavior.

The Social Studies for Non-Arabs Curriculum deepens learners' understanding of social, political and economic systems; improves their comprehension of movements in local and world history; enables them to analyze the relationships between humans and their natural environment, and facilitates the development of a strong appreciation of the importance of relating knowledge of past people, events and civilizations to present and future challenges.

Therefore, a need has been identified to transform the Moral Education and Social Studies curricula into one enhanced and comprehensive curriculum, which

- Preserves the rationale, purpose and intended learning outcomes of both curricula
- Consists of a clearly structured framework
- Contains a well-planned and progressive scope and sequence of units
- Ensures comprehensive and efficient coverage of all learning outcomes

Background

The UAE is committed to the development of a National Curriculum for its youth, which puts the nation at the forefront of worldwide efforts to develop human capital capabilities, promote values of tolerance and respect, and contribute to the making of better global citizens.

To this end, in July 2016, the new subject of Moral Education was introduced to the UAE National Curriculum program of study, alongside Social Studies, for all students across the UAE.

Annual program evaluations of both Moral Education and Social Studies have highlighted the multitude of positive impacts on the knowledge, attitudes and behaviours of students of both these subjects. The same program evaluations also highlighted further National Curriculum development opportunities to support schools, teachers and students to make improvements in the efficient organisation and delivery of these subjects.

One such opportunity is the merging of Moral Education and Social Studies to create a fully formed singular coherent program of study for all K-12 students, which is void of curriculum overlap and the need to address some similar learning outcomes through two different routes.

The merging of Moral Education and Social Studies has now been completed and a new single subject created: 'Moral Social Cultural Studies'







A generation of individuals who are united by more than their school, curriculum, performance, philosophy or religion, but by the moral attitudes and behaviours that underpin them, is critical in developing the human capital capabilities, which will sustain the long term success of a nation.

To enhance the legacy of the UAE as a nation at the forefront of worldwide efforts to develop morally strong individuals, who exhibit the knowledge, skills, attitudes and behaviours to make sense of the world around them and thrive as happy, successful and responsible global citizens.

SOCIAL STUDIES

Young people need a deep knowledge of facts, concepts, principles and perspectives, which make up the Social Studies disciplines to help them make sense of the world around them.

They need to be able to apply this body of knowledge to complex situations and contexts, to think critically about important issues, communicate their findings and interpret human actions.

Ultimately, young people need to be prepared for careers and lifelong learning in a local and global context, by being equipped with the tools needed to succeed in the dynamic and changing world of tomorrow.

MORAL EDUCATION

The purpose of Moral Education is to create a generation of citizens who

- ▼ Tolerate and accept Culturals different from their own
- Understand and appreciate their own local heritage and Cultural
- Are armed with the knowledge, resources and skills that allow them to make good, well informed and responsible judgements about challenging matters of moral importance
- Understand their civic system, rights and responsibilities and are aware of the role they need to play to support and sustain the nation's developmental efforts



MORAL, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL STUDIES

The purpose of Moral, Social and Cultural Studies is to develop a nation of responsible global citizens who

- Possess moral values and a secure knowledge of past and present events, which they use to make well informed judgements and morally sound decisions
- Know, understand, and tolerate local and global Culturals different from their own, understanding how they evolved and their past and present impacts on the world
- Understand the governing institutions and their rights and responsibilities as global citizens living in the UAE Develop a and sustainable lifestyle
- Demonstrate loyalty and sense of belonging to the UAE community.
- Work efficiently with physical and digital resources to construct evidence-rich oral and written professional discourse equipping for a career with lifeline learning.

SOCIAL STUDIES

The purpose of Social Studies is to enable young people to

MORAL EDUCATION

The Moral Education Framework consists of four pillars:

- Character and Morality:
 Developing the individual as a moral being.
 Developing the language, understanding and skills of moral thinking and reasoning.
- 2. The Individual and the Community: Moral issues confronting the individual in a variety of social contexts.

 Applying moral thinking to the development of individuals as members of their communities.
- 3. Civic Studies: Becoming a citizen in the UAE and wider world, and the moral decisions and choices that it involves. Developing character and moral thinking in the context of civic duty and responsibility.
- 4. Cultural Studies: Concepts of morality embodied in the history and culture of the UAE. Applying moral thinking and reasoning to an understanding of an inherited past and shaping of the future.



MORAL, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL STUDIES

- 1. Moral Studies: Developing the individual as a moral being. Developing the language, understanding and skills of moral thinking and reasoning. Applying moral thinking to the individual in a variety of social contexts, as well as to the development of others in their school, family and local communities.
- 2. Social Studies: Equipping individuals with a grounding in the common knowledge of the past, human geography, sociology, economics, information literacy and information processing to create an awareness of the commonality of humanity and to understand the value of lifeline learning.
- 3. Cultural Studies: Infusing individuals with knowledge of milestones of UAE national social, economic, and cultural development, heritage and national identity symbols, and the rights and responsibilities of living in the UAE as a global citizen.

SOCIAL STUDIES

The Social Studies Framework consists of nine standards:

- History: Significant people, events, developments that shaped communities and world regions in different periods. The effects of technological developments on societies and social change over time.
- Civics: Responsibilities and privileges of belonging to communities inside and outside of the UAE. The factors that shape nations and governing structures in the larger global community.
- **3. Geography:** Important features of the earth, including surface structures, national resources and climates. How human activities affect the earth and are affected by it.
- 4. Sociology: How and why communities and societies are formed. Reasons for social change and social transitions across geographical regions and time periods.
- Economics: Economic principles, markets and systems. The role of government in developing national and international economies.
- Information Literacy: Identify and evaluate resources. Evidence to support claims using appropriate sources.
- 7. Information Processing (Research):Collect data and information on various topics using a range of methods, including digital and technology-based applications. Work collaboratively. Prepare arguments and explanations, arrive at conclusions, and critique their own anyd others' conclusions.
- **8. Moral Education:** Demonstrate an awareness of moral principles to assist in ethical reasoning and decision-making based on fairness and tolerance.
- 9. UAE Cultural, Heritage and Tolerance: Identify milestones of UAE national development and elements of its heritage. Explain the responsibilities and privileges of living in the UAE and demonstrate a sense of belonging to the UAE community
